### Ecosystem accounting in the EU – the INCA project

#### **INCA project** by ESTAT, JRC, ENV, RTD and EEA:

- To develop EU wide ecosystem accounts (methods, data sources, accounts)
- To support the drafting of the SEEA EA international handbook
- To support research on ecosystem accounting
- To support Member States in their national work
- <u>Final report of Phase 2</u> released in June 2021 (first comprehensive set of ecosystem account for the EU)
- To operationalise the accounts and support the planned EU legal module on ecosystem accounting => INCA phase 3






### Implementation in the EU – INCA phase 3

- Regular and timely production of EU-level ecosystem accounts
  - Updating (2018) and improving EU-level estimates, released by Eurostat (based on INCA)
- <u>Supporting the legal proposal amending Regulation 691/2011</u> on European environmental-economic accounts
- Support to Member States by Eurostat:
  - GIS plug-in tools for ecosystem services accounts (to be shared with MS and the public)
     first half of 2023
  - Methodological work Task force on ecosystem accounting
  - Statistical grants for NSIs and ONAs (21 projects/14 countries funded since 2017)
  - ESTP courses on ecosystem accounting annual since 2018




## **INCA** platform













### Proposed legislation on ecosystem accounts

- Proposed as amendment of <u>Regulation (EU) No 691/2011</u> on European environmental-economic accounts (Regulation currently includes 6 'modules' of environmental accounts)
- Timeline:
  - Discussions with Member States started in 2020;
  - Draft regulation adopted by the Commission in June 2022;
  - Legal process now continues in the European Parliament and Council;
  - Testing and voluntary reporting by Member States starting soon
  - First mandatory reporting by Member States (if successful) 2026 with reference year 2024;



### The proposal at a glance

- Ecosystem extent accounts (reporting every 3 years; 12 types of ecosystems see table below);
- Ecosystem condition accounts (every 3 years; for a subset of 5 terrestrial ecosystem types and subset of indicators/ variables)

• Ecosystem services accounts (annual; for the 10 terrestrial ecosystems; only

physical accounts)

1. crop provision

- 2. pollination
- 3. wood provision
- 4. air filtration (PM adsorbed)
- 5. global climate regulation (net sequestration and storage of carbon)
- 6. local (i.e. urban) climate regulation (reduction of temperature)
- 7. nature-based tourism (overnight stays)
- First reporting in 2026 (data for year 2024)

### The proposed ecosystem condition accounts

#### for settlements and other artificial areas:

- green areas in cities and adjacent towns and suburbs (%);
- concentration of particulate matter with a diameter up to 2.5 μm in cities (μg/m³).

#### for both cropland and grassland:

- soil organic carbon stock in topsoil (tonne/ha);
- common farmland bird index.

#### for forest and woodland:

- dead wood (m³/ha);
- tree cover density (%).

#### for coastal beaches, dunes and wetlands:

• share of artificial impervious area cover (%).



### Task force on ecosystem accounting (TF EA)

- Chaired by Eurostat; Members: AT, DE, EE, ES, FI, FR, IE, IT, NL, SK, NO;
  - + DG ENV, JRC, EEA as observers
- Set up in June 2021; ten meetings since then
  - To assist Eurostat in the development of the legal module
  - To provide technical guidance to compile the accounts;
  - To advance the implementation of SEEA EA in the EU in a coordinated and methodologically robust way
- TF develops guidance → submitted for testing and then endorsements to 'WG MESA' → guidance published by Eurostat as methodological guidance for MS
- All documents discussed in the task force are public in <u>CIRCABC</u>



### Preparation in Eurostat and in NSIs...

- Testing the guidance on extent accounts planned for 09-12/2022;
  - 11+ countries signed up for testing (IT, DE, DK, EE, IE, HU, CZ, HR, AT, NL, LU)
- Test compilations of ecosystem services and condition accounts – tbd;
- Voluntary data collection will be set up before legislation enters into force;
- Grants for NSIs to produce ecosystem accounts continue until legislation enters into force.
